- (2) which are **less important to address immediately** but should be addressed secondarily
 - (3) which are **not currently** areas of concern
 - (4) what we are missing

We will use your input in the creation of draft updated goals for the Comprehensive Plan, which we will then share with you for your feedback.

What We're Asking About



The first set of issues is related to life in Charlottesville in general and what we need to consider to work toward a positive and equitable future.



The second set of issues is related specifically to **affordable housing**.

"Affordable housing" is a term that incorporates many distinct but related issues, and we need your input about which areas you think are most critical to address.


